1. Joint scientific goals:

1. The collective volume “Interconnectivity in the Mediterranean and Pontic World during the Hellenistic and Roman Periods” was edited, being a key mid-term activity (as reflected in project proposal). It was meant as an important step towards accomplishing the major project goal – publication of a collective work, which would reflect, in a more complex and compelling way than before, the external contacts maintained among the urban Pontic communities. This activity was developed during a period of ten months (from February till November) and the effort made by Victor Cojocaru and Madalina Dana, as editors, was supported by all other team members who contributed to this volume through their papers. We would like to underline that a number of foreign specialists not involved in the project itself also contributed to the above-mentioned volume (among them Altay Coşkun who is co-editor of the work). This fact led to an increased visibility of project research agenda and outcomes at a national and international. It is important to mention that one of the major project goals was to set up an international dialogue on research problems related to *polis* in the Hellenistic and Roman times. By editing a collective volume, which comprises the studies of 31 specialists from 9 European countries, as well as researchers from Turkey, USA and Canada, we consider our project goal successfully accomplished. The immediate outcome was the configuration of a network comprising specialists interested in doing research on aspects related to the Black Sea in Antiquity. This existing collaboration will serve as a solid ground for our application to EU-funded projects. The concrete contribution of each project team member is reflected in Part B of the present report. In what follows, we would like to

The entire process of editing the volume “Interconnectivity” implied an intense dialogue with all these specialists during the entire stage 2014.

2. A Round Table, attended by the team members and a number of guest specialists from Iasi, was organized on January 24, 2014. The major discussions, involving all participants, were focused on the diversity of external relations models based on documentary material, their similarities and peculiarities. Three presentations were made during the event. Victor Cojocaru made a presentation on “*Bibliographia classica orae septentrionalis Ponti Euxini I*”. Lucian Munteanu and Sever Boțan made a brief presentation on project-related activities developed during phase 2013. Costel Chiriac brought into discussion the external relations dynamics of Greek cities from the West and North Black Sea region based on circulation of vitreous material. In addition to this, the development strategy for activities foreseen for phase 2014 was discussed. In order to fulfill our project we suggested the organization of an international symposium entitled “*Mobility in Research on the Black Sea Region*”, aimed at sharing project PN-II-ID-PCE-2011-3-0054 research outcomes. On the other hand, this event was conceived as an important step towards applying for an EU-funded project (H2020), which would make possible a continuation of our research on some aspects related to external relations of the Greek cities from the Black Sea area. The discussion initiated during the Round Table had a continuation during the entire year 2014 and led to a fruitful collaboration with the team of another Idei (Idea) project, namely PN-II-ID-PCE-2012-4-0490 *The “Other” in Action. The Barbarization of Rome and the Romanization of the World* (<http://arheo.ro/romanization>). This collaboration became a possibility to reach a stronger national and international impact. At the same time, we agreed on the title for a joint symposium planned for stage 2015– “*Mobility in Research on the Black Sea Region (PN-II-ID-PCE-2011-3-0054 and PN-II-ID-PCE-2012-4-0490 to H2020)*”.

3. Foreign study visits. Project team members undertook seven mobility flows abroad. The goal of these visits were related to both, gathering new data aimed at reaching stated project goals and, on the other hand, disseminating own research findings – Munich/Germany (Livia BUZOIANU), Trier/Germany (Victor COJOCARU), Munich/Germany (Mădălina DANA), Tours/France (Victor COJOCARU), Krakow/Poland (Costel CHIRIAC), Munich/Germany (Victor COJOCARU), Bonn/Germany (Victor COJOCARU). 4. Domestic study visits. Project team members undertook thirteen domestic study visits (to specialized establishments and to archeological sites). The last work comprises the papers based on the presentations made at the International Symposium from July 8-12, 2013, organized within PN-II-ID-PCE-2011-3-0054 project. By publishing the three books at a prestigious foreign Publishing House and a Romanian Publishing House accredited by CNCS, we have successfully accomplished the most important goals stated in the project (see below Part B). Pontica et Mediterranea

). This collection was meant to support studies on history of Antiquity, epigraphy, classical archeology, numismatics and iconography, at a national level and increase their international visibility. In addition to the above-mentioned works (

) – altogether comprising 2044 pages – the project-related research outcomes were reflected in the publication or acceptance for publication of forty-five studies and papers (of them 22 published in 2014) and of eight extensive critical reviews. More details can be found on our project website (

During stage 2015 we are going to make a presentation on research outcomes, prospective research directions and publish a single author volume (Sever BOȚAN).

· to elaborate a comprehensive study regarding tiles production workshops in the Black Sea in the context of Hellenistic coroplastic and establish the relationship between the Pontic workshops and models of the Aegean world (Iulian Bîrzescu). The successful accomplishment of the mid-term goal was reflected in the publication of the following study *Some Remarks on Hellenistic Terracotta Offerings in the Western Pontic Sanctuaries* , in: *Interconnectivity*, p. 269-280. During stage 2015 we are going to make a presentation on research outcomes and prospective research directions.

· to elaborate a comprehensive study regarding Pontic colonies relations with the Aegean world as reflected in the sculptural art (Florina Panait-Bîrzescu). The successful accomplishment of project goals was reflected in the publication of the following study, *Wandering Cult Images between the Aegean and the Black Sea Cities in Hellenistic and Roman Times: from Dionysos Kathegemon to Dionysos Karpophoros* , in: *Interconnectivity*, p. 393-413. During stage 2015 we are going to make a presentation on research outcomes and prospective research directions.

· to elaborate a comprehensive study concerning the movement of goods in the western Black Sea basin, as reflected by the “commercial type” seals found in the Greek towns the area in Roman times (1st–3rd centuries A.D.), since they are relevant to the connections with the micro-Asian world (Costel CHIRIAC & Lucian MUNTEANU). The successful accomplishment of project goals was reflected in the publication of the following study *Trade Connections between*

Asia Minor and the West Pontic Area in the 4th

Century CE. Some Sphragistic Considerations

, in: *Interconnectivity*, p. 299-330. During stage 2015 we are going to make a presentation on research outcomes and prospective research directions.

· George Bilavschi and Diana Stah – through continuous support offered to the project director in issues related to management– contributed to the accomplishment of remaining project goals. Based on their contribution a frame for collaboration of the present team members in a larger international context was created. What we mean here is the exploration of possibilities of continuing the current project PN-II-ID-PCE-2011-3-0054 with a funding scheme within H2020 (SC6 - Europe in a changing world - inclusive, innovative and reflective societies, SC7 - Secure societies - protecting freedom and security of Europe and its citizens, MSCA). At the same time, we focused on the changing dynamics of European Research Policies and their potential short- and middle-term impact on opportunities to reach future resources for our current research endeavors. At this point we have already initiated a dialogue with some national and foreign partner institutions on the possibility to implement a European-funded project which could bring the research endeavors of the current project to a new level. Likewise, we count on a similarly efficient cooperation we have had so far with the administrative staff of the Romanian Academy, the Branch of Iași.

□□□□□□ To conclude with, we believe that – in full compliance with the objectives for stage 2014 (correlated with the goals accomplished during stages 2011, 2012 and 2013) – we managed to reach the major goal of our project, namely, publication of a collective work which would reflect, in a more complex and compelling way than before, the external contacts maintained among the urban Pontic communities. The single author volume and the two collective volumes mentioned earlier (see Part A 5) is the best evidence in this respect. By organizing the International Symposium “Mobility in Research on the Black Sea Region (PN-II-ID-PCE-2011-3-0054 and PN-II-ID-PCE-2012-4-0490 to H2020)”, foreseen for 2015, we are going to increase the international visibility of our research outcomes.
